The Student Support Card’s web-based application provides the measurement tools that integrate the best research on youth development and life-long success.

As part of our program’s Connecting Activities and other components, participating students login to their Student Support Card account to complete the suite of surveys that automatically calculates and flushes out their full-color Kaleidoscope Snapshot (see sample on reverse side).

An integral part of our Phlight Club events, students take their data a step further in recording, processing, and internalizing related data immediately using their Phlight Logs and a set of ROYGBIV crayons.

Together, the Connecting Activities, Survey Data, and Phlight Logs help students, and those who care about them, assess and reflect on their full-color state.

Furthermore, because the data is stored online, it can be viewed by users who have been provided access. Kaleidoscopes are maintained chronologically, with the ability to dig deeper into the student’s replies underlying the data.


The data, therefore, can help the students, counselors, and parents have more meaningful conversations to better support the youth for success.

RED the rule of five

Who are the adults who anchor your web?
Consider the adults you know — family members, school staff, coaches, etc. — who are looking out for your best interests and who see the best in you. Which adults:

- expect you to achieve in school and in life?
- see your unique talents, intelligences and often remind you of them?
- are there for you, all the time, no matter what else is happening?
- would do whatever it takes to protect you from harm?
- do whatever you need ahead of their own? (skills you need to be...)

GREEN growing your balloon

Green represents your inborn/biological talents, gifts, and intelligences; our brains. These gifts (personality characteristics, temperament, physical attributes, to name a few) were given to each of us in seed form, and it is up to each of us to 1) identify our talents and gifts, 2) work to grow them, and 3) use them in the world. These inborn seeds of talent eventually grow the balloon that rests upon the web of support.

Think about what comes “naturally to you”. What is right and strong about your personality? Do you see the best in things? Do you have grit — that force that says “Never Give Up!”? Do you have lots of energy and want to “do things”? Which of these traits are you working to grow and keep strong? What could you do to grow them even further?

Your efforts to become anyone, or do anything, you want will be most effective when directed at growing your personal talents and how you are smart, along with your determination and ability to bounce back from bad things that happen, or may have happened, in your life.
