The mission of the Early Childhood Services Bureau is to improve the quality, affordability, and accessibility of child care in Montana. The programs that are offered are Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarships, Best Beginnings Quality Programs, Child and Adult Care Food Program, Head Start-State Collaboration Office, and School Readiness.

The **Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarships** offer child care payment assistance to low-income parents who are working and/or participating in pre-approved education programs, with certain limitations.

The **Best Beginnings Quality Programs** provides child care providers with start-up, expansion, and training opportunities. The programs have been thoroughly designed to maximize limited resources so that access to quality early childhood programs is improved for all children.

The **Child and Adult Care Food Program** provides reimbursement for meals served in participating institutions when those meals meet the federal US Department of agriculture (USDA) regulations and align with the current Dietary Guidelines for Americans. The CACFP is available to infants, children, and impaired or older adults enrolled in institutions that participate in the CACFP. Eligible institutions are family day care homes, child care centers, afterschool and outside school hour facilities, adult day care facilities, and emergency shelters.

The **Head Start-State Collaboration Office** has the goal of impacting the lives of low-income children and families by influencing state and local policy and the effective delivery of services, while linking Head Start programs and communities through collaborative relationships.

The **School Readiness Program** provides education to families, communities, service providers, and schools on how to support and development of skills and positive behaviors, as well as enhances the environment in which children spend their time.

Blind and Low Vision Services provides a broad range of services to assist eligible individuals with visual disabilities in finding or maintaining employment and

increasing independence. They have three programs: Vocational Rehabilitation, Visual Medical, and Older Blind.

The **Blind and Low Vision Vocational Rehabilitation** Program offers services that include evaluation, career counseling and guidance, medical and psychological, training, job development and placement, rehabilitation technology, post employment, referrals, instruction, mobility training, and low vision.

The **Visual Medical Program** assists people who need eye treatment to prevent blindness, restore sight, or provide other appropriate eye treatment where loss of vision cannot be prevented or sight restored. Services include diagnosis, surgery and treatment, hospitalization, prosthetic appliances, transportation, and follow-up exams.

The **Older Blind Program** assists older visually impaired or blind individuals. Services include low vision evaluations, purchase of adaptive aids, daily living skill instruction, orientation and mobility training, referral to other agencies, and other supplemental services.

All clients eligible for LIEAP are automatically eligible for **weatherization**. The client's homes are ranked on a priority list according to income and energy usage. Weatherization measures may include a furnace tune-up, caulking, weather stripping, insulation, storm windows, vent dampers, window quilts, replacement of broken glass, and repair of primary doors. Weatherization workers may not be able to install all the materials you may need, but they will do the most important weatherization within the dollar limits allows.

**Housing Counseling** includes budget counseling, reverse annuity mortgage counseling, pre-purchase, default/foreclosure, and rental counseling. It is provided to first time homebuyers, those in default of their mortgage, and low-income elderly homeowners that wish to participate in the Reverse Annuity Mortgage Program.

The **Section 8 Rental Assistance Program** helps participants pay their rent on a long-term basis. Once the tenant is approved for the program, they pay approximately 1/3 of their adjusted income for their rent and the state pays the balance.

The **Section 8 Homebuyer Program** of the Montana Department of Commerce allows eligible participants in the Section 8 housing choice voucher programs, including participants with portable vouchers, the option of purchasing a home with their Section 8 assistance rather than renting.

The **Family Self-Sufficiency Program** is a voluntary program for Second 8 participants who desire to become independent of government assistance. The program allows rental assistance, together with public and private resources, to help families achieve economic independence and self-sufficiency. The program works with families through intensive case management to establish their needs, and identify barriers for reaching and maintaining self sufficiency by creating a plan establishing short and long term goals.

The **Emergency Services** program helps with utility deposits, past due rent and utilities of one month and only on a one-time basis.

**Adoption:** Children who are available for adoption through the Child and Family Services Division have been removed from their own families because of abuse, neglect or other family problems that make it unsafe for them to remain at home. The rights of the family have been terminated making the children available for adoption. Married couples or single adults who have an approved pre-placement evaluation or adoptive home study may adopt in the State of Montana. The Child and Family Services Division helps with the application for a home study and provides training for all foster and adoptive parents.

**Foster Care:** Children needing foster care range in age from infants to teenagers. They come from many different backgrounds and some have been abused, neglected, or abandoned by their parents or other caretakers. Foster parents are expected to provide for the physical and emotional needs of children placed in their home and provide a safe and stable home environment. Anyone who is at least 18 years of age and in good physical and mental health may apply to become a foster parent. Single people, couples, people with or without children, all may be eligible. The ability to provide an environment that protects and promotes the well-being of a child or children is most important.
